Statement of Evidence for Part 2 Claim BA

The path is first recorded on the deposits Western Railway (Birmingham and Liverpool Line) 1850. The Book of Reference describes parcel 207, in Aston, as "footway", which although it is shown and numbered on the plan, is not listed in Warwickshire County Record Office at OS111/1850.

The path is also shown on the deposited plans for the Birmingham, Erdington and Aston Oldfield Railway 1890. The Book of Reference describes parcel 122, in Aston, as "arable and footway", parcel 127 as "occupation road and footway", and parcel 132 as "arable, for occupation road and footway". The Survey of Highways, (Held by WCRO at OS111/1890).

The path is shown on the first edition of the Ordnance Survey six inch map (1880's).

The path is shown on another path of the Sessional Highways Order of 1901. (Held by WCRO at Q347/1880) The central section of the road (Edwards Road) by proposed estate road of 1905. (Held by WCRO at Q347/1880)

The path is shown on the map of the City Council extended the remaining section of the path as a public right of way.

It is considered, therefore, that it is reasonable to say that the route subsists as a public right of way and should be recorded as such on the definitive map.
