**VEHICLE RELEASE GUARANTEE - (To include conditions of statutory notice)**

1. If the seized property is a vehicle with a registration mark, and you are claiming to be the registered keeper of the vehicle (the 'lock'), you must produce the registration document (the 'log book').
2. The person claiming the vehicle must provide proof of name and one acceptable proof of address. Any claim for release of the vehicle must be accompanied by sufficient information to enable the authority to make a determination of the settlement to be made. The proof of name and one acceptable proof of address or other identification for both the claimant and the vehicle must be provided. You must provide a list of other acceptable proofs of name and one acceptable proof of address examples.

**Proof of identity for a person acting as agent for a company and her legal representatives**

Where an agent makes a claim on behalf of a company and the principal company will require the agent to produce proof of name and address of themselves and the company. Any claim made by a vehicle hire company will be required to produce proof of name and address proofs described above.

**ADVISORY** - In compliance with Birmingham City Council's safety and compliance with the Council's seizure recovery policy on a public road, by a person who holds a valid licence of a recovery vehicle with Birmingham City Council, any vehicle which is defective, is not roadworthy or is a nuisance, may be released in circumstances where the vehicle is to be driven away, where the vehicle is to be driven away. (This will not apply where the vehicle is to be driven away.)
