Vehicle release/recovery restrictions may be imposed in respect of this notice.

Any claim for release must be made before the expiry of the notice period [No later than 15 working days after the date of seizure].

The Authority may be of the opinion that it is necessary to retain the seized property for the duration of an investigation into the alleged offence.

A seizure authority may not be liable for damage to or destruction of property where a claimant has not notified the authority in writing within the time specified in the notice. The authority did not determine whether the claimant had notified the authority.

A copy of this notice has been placed on the vehicle, the registered keeper and any other persons named in the notice. A copy of this notice has also been placed on the City Council website.

**VEHICLE RELEASE GUIDE** (To be included with statement)

2. If you are not the registered keeper, you must provide one or more of the following documents to prove your identity and address:
